

Wired Network Authentication Configuring 802.1x for Windows XP

Connect to the HWS wired network, follow the steps below:

Note: To only have Internet access, no configuration is required, just plug in a network cable. These steps are for accessing HWS network resources on campus.

1. If you have the Cisco Clean Access Agent installed on your computer, uninstall it from the **Start Menu > Control Panel > Add/Remove Programs**



2. Connect to the Internet and download and install the latest updates for Windows by opening Internet Explorer and clicking **Tools > Windows Update**, then following the directions and installing all updates in the **Express** version.

Note: You may need to install multiple rounds of updates.

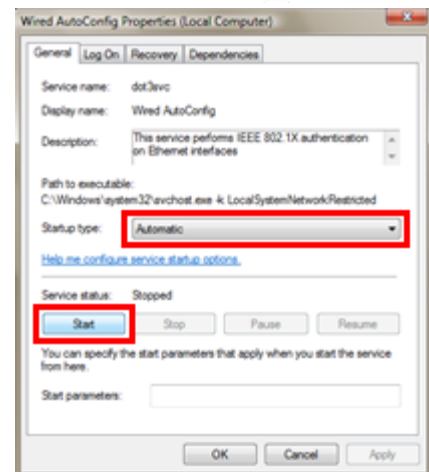
3. Click **Start > Control Panel**
4. On the left, make sure **Classic View** is selected

5. Double-click on **Administrative Tools**



6. Double-click on **Services**
7. Scroll down to **Wired AutoConfig** and **double-click it**

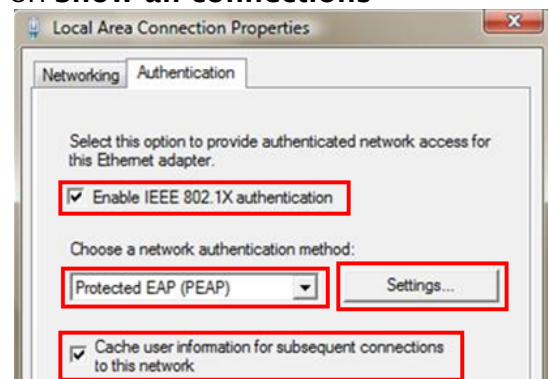
- Next to Startup type select **Automatic**
- Under Service Status click on **Start**
Note: If you are able to click Stop, Pause, or Restart, then the service is already started and you can proceed without clicking anything
- Click **OK**



8. **Close** out of all the windows you just opened
9. Click **Start**, select **Connect To** and click on **Show all connections**

10. Right-click **Local Area Connection** and select **Properties**

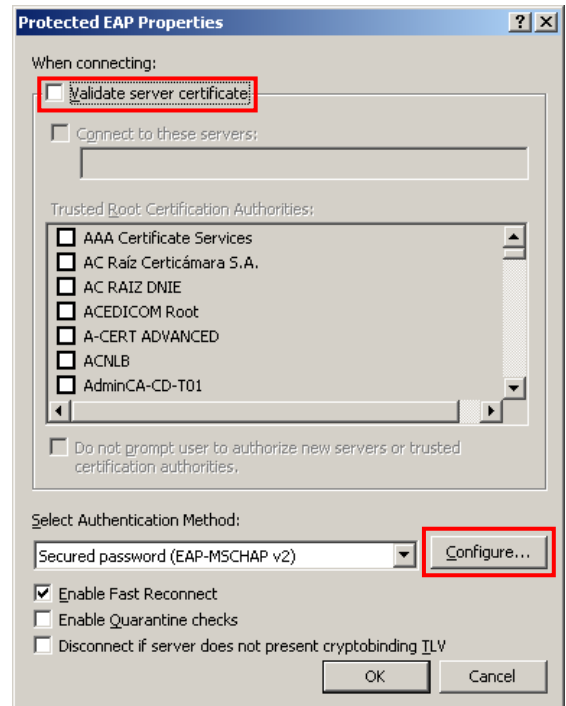
11. Select the Authentication tab
 - a. Make sure **Enable IEEE 802.1x authentication** is checked
 - b. Under Choose an authentication method, make sure **Protected EAP (PEAP)** is selected
 - c. Check **Cache user information** for



subsequent connections to this network

d. Click **Settings**

12. In the Protected EAP Properties Window
 - a. Uncheck **Validate Server Certificate**
 - b. Under Select Authentication Method choose **Secured Password (EAP- MSCHAP v2)**
 - c. Uncheck **Enable fast reconnect**
 - d. Click **Configure**
 - e. Uncheck **Automatically use my Windows logon name and password (if any)**
 - f. Click **OK**



13. Click **OK two more times** and close the remaining Windows

14. A box will pop-up in the lower right portion of your screen requesting additional information, **click on it**

Note: It may take a minute or so for this box to appear.

15. In the window that appears type in your **HWS username and password** and click **OK**



You should now be able to use the HWS secure wired network (if not, try restarting the computer)
