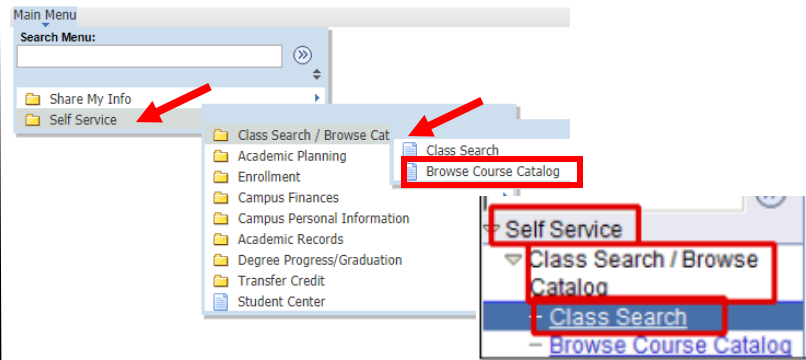
2. Click on Campus Solutions

Description

This class introduces American Studies as a scholarly field, and investigates how American Studies scholars, think, argue, research and write. Beginning with the history of American Studies, students read "classical" works and identify the major intellectual and methodological questions of the field. Course materials include American Studies scholarship across the 20th century, including the "myth and symbol" school, literary and feminist critiques; material and popular culture; questions of border, empire, and nation; and critical race studies. Students will also practice the archival and other research techniques underlying interdisciplinary research, and explore the limitations and benefits of the different tools we can use to study the U.S. (Staff, offered annually)
