SUMMER OF SERVICE – INTERNSHIPS IN GENEVA

Summer of Service, established in 2010, The Center for Community Engagement and Service-Learning is thrilled to partner with local non-profit agencies through a collaborative internship program that will engage HWS students in 300 hours of service during June, July and August. Although subject to change, internships examples include:

- ✓ The Boys and Girls Club @ Goodman Street Intern will coordinate the Summer Art program, we are seeking a creative and artistic student who has a demonstrated ability to work well with large groups of children. Must demonstrate initiative and organization, experience with developing lesson plans will be given priority)
- ✓ The Boys and Girls Club @ The Community Center Intern will coordinate the summer lunch program, which provides continuity for youth dependent upon meals received at school during the academic year. Additional programs may include the Garden Club and Youth Athletics, priority will be given to candidates willing and able to drive the Club 12 passenger van.
- ✓ The Geneva Middle School / Geneva High School Intern will assist principals in school success data collection efforts. Additional responsibilities could include summer school facilitation and proctoring exams. Priority will be given to students with quantitative reasoning and familiarity with Microsoft Excel.

The HWS students will earn a \$3,000 stipend and housing will be provided (if selected applicant chooses to live on campus). The primary goals of the program are to:

- ✓ Provide HWS Students with an opportunity to expand their skillset that pertain to non-profit management, civic leadership, and educational leadership
- ✓ Help eliminate barriers to K-12 school success and support economically disadvantaged youth
- ✓ Align hands-on learning opportunities with Geneva 2020, our community's collective impact initiative that advances college/career readiness, literacy programming, and the Geneva High School graduation rate
- ✓ Build organizational capacity at local non-profit, youth serving agencies
