Nation, Deer Clan is the Executive Director of the Seneca Media and Communications Center. He has been a lifelong photographer, videographer and independent media producer, working especially on Indigenous rights and environmental issues. Corwin has a Ph.D. in natural resources

from Cornell University and has done extensive research on the intersection of digital storytelling, Indigenous ways of knowing and environmental education. He made four trips to Oceti Sakowin camp at Standing Rock to document the water protectors movement against the Dakota Access Pipeline. He later worked with environmental organizations and concerned citizens to successfully stop the Northern Access Pipeline, which was slated to transport fracked gas through Western New York.
