- An academic plan that will bring you back into compliance for the following term. This plan must be approved by your academic advisor and/or Dean.

\***Extenuating circumstances** are defined as unanticipated and unavoidable events or situations beyond a student's control that prevented the student from successfully completing a course or meeting the terms of a prior appeal. Examples of extenuating circumstances could include (but are not limited to):

- 1) the death of a relative, loved one or student;
- 2) the personal injury or illness of the student;
- 3) other extenuating circumstances.

**Examples of unacceptable extenuating circumstances** include (but are not limited to) withdrawal to avoid a failing grade, too many courses attempted, disagreement with instructor, and/or need for financial aid.
