Quick Tip:

Using An "Exit Ticket"

Exit tickets are a piece of paper (like an index card), quick online survey, or a verbal statement after a program. The student answers a question and turns in their response prior to leaving. *Orientation recently used an exit ticket to assess if students could identify 3 specific resources.*

DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

Student Conduct

As part of a pre/post student conduct hearing experience survey, 53% of students stated they were "a little bit" to "very" anxious prior to their hearing, compared to only **14%** after their hearing. In addition, **52%** of students reported taking responsibility for their behavior prior to a hearing and **78%** taking responsibility after their hearing. In addition, 86% of students strongly agreed that their hearing officer approached the hearing process with fairness and integrity (*100% of students agreed with the statement*).

Residential Education

In addition to Odell's Trick or Treat, the Residential Education Office hosted a Halloween Carnival for the Geneva Community. **91%** of community members agreed or strongly agreed that the event had a positive impact on the Geneva Community and **93%** would recommend the event to other members of the community. One parent wrote "We come every year and love this! The inside carnival is great, keep it up!"

Greek Life

37 students participated in TIPS training, which trains for the responsible serving and consumption of alcohol. **97%** of participants passed the final examination which tested the participants' understanding of signs of intoxication, alcohol statistics, and emergency procedures. The average score for participants was 96.6%.

74 men have successfully completed New Member Education in Fall of 2017 in eight fraternal organizations. 43 women have been initiated into the Theta Pi Alpha Sorority. 2/3 of active Greek men participated in an Anti-Hazing workshop that reviewed the important educational factors of hazing prevention education.

Campus Life/Student Activities: Kaleidoscope

Last year, *Kaleidoscope*, the extended orientation program, had a goal to increase academic readiness of first-year students by incorporating the Center for Teaching & Learning into the first-year sessions and prepare students for academic logistics. As a result of Orientation, **71%** of students stated they agreed/strongly agreed that they had a clear understanding of how to register for classes, compared to 33% from 2016. In addition, 79% of students reported having developed effective study skills compared to 65% in 2016.
