Overview

Hobart and William Smith are independent liberal arts colleges offering over 45 majors and 68 minors. HWS is unique in that while Hobart and William Smith historically were separate institutions, they merged in 1943 as equal partner institutions. Today, Hobart and William Smith students attend classes together, can live in the same dorms, and engage in the colleges as one institution. However, when students graduate, male-identified individuals graduate from Hobart, and female-identified individuals graduate from William Smith. The Colleges also have this distinction with separate student governments and honors societies.

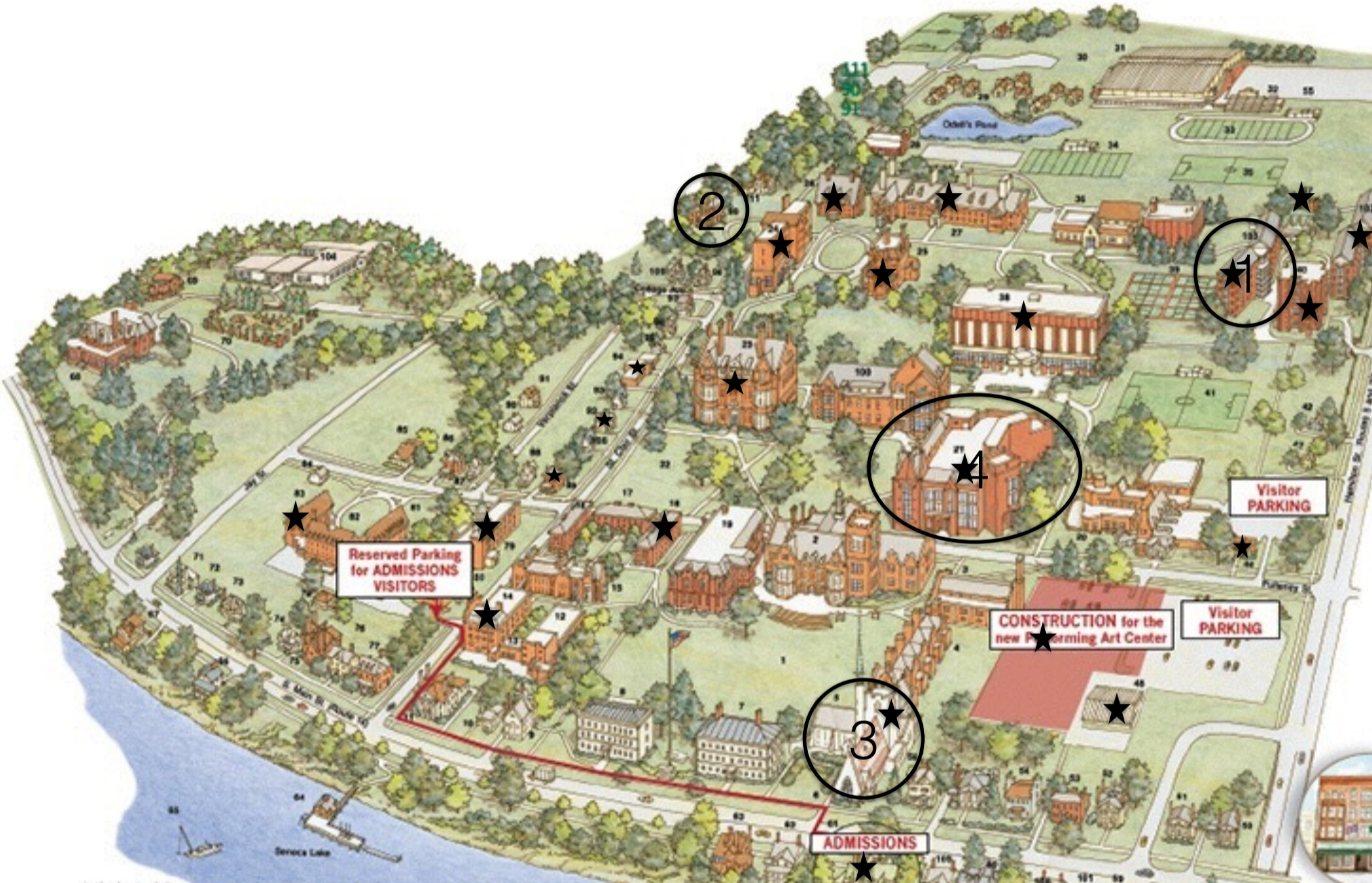

| HWS just opened their LGBTQ+ Resource Center in the Fall of 2017. The Resource Center offers many resources such as Safe Zone Trainings, fun events, weekly conversation groups, and many other things! | Unfortunately, transition related services are not offered at Hobart and William Smith, and are not covered by its student healthcare plan. However, the counseling center and Hubbs Health Center are both made up of healthcare professionals who are trained to meet the basic needs of all students. | Hobart and William Smith do have gender inclusive housing available. Transgender students are housed with the gender they identify as, and often have roommates just as all other students do. HWS' Residential Education works to ensure that Transgender and non-binary individuals are housed in safe and adequate housing. | All-gender bathrooms exist in many of our campus's buildings, including at least one in every dormitory. They are in certain academic buildings, but not all. For the time being, every all-gender bathroom is single stall restroom, not a communal restroom. | Hobart and William Smith Colleges have one LGBTQ+ themed house: QPOC House. This house is home to many of the queer people of color who attend Hobart and William Smith. The house is a safe and accepting environment for all queer people of color, and often host events ranging from dinners to concerts. |

LGBTQ+ Student Life at Hobart and William Smith

Hobart and William Smith's LGBTQ+ specific student life is usually limited to events and talks hosted by one of our three LGBTQ+ groups on campus: QPOC House, the HWS Pride Alliance, and the LGBTQ+ Resource Center. Past events have included drag shows, movie screenings, and concerts on the HWS Quad. Student life for LGBTQ+ students on campus is very rarely queer specific, and most queer students identify more with their other social groups, such as fellow classmates, club members, or teammates, than with queer groups.

1- DeCordova Hall:

- Home of the LGBTQ+ Resource Center
- Dormitory for Students in their Sophomore year and older
- Home of the DeCordova Café, an in-dormitory café which serves coffee, snacks, and other refreshments

2- QPOC House:

- Theme house designated as a safe space and living environment for Queer People of Color
- Facilitates conversations about intersectionality on campus, and in broader contexts
- Plan events to educate about and celebrate QPOC identities

3- Demarest Hall

- Academic building home to many academic departments in the humanities
- Home to the LGBT Studies and Women's Studies departments
- Also home to the Fisher Center for the study of Men and Women

4- Warren Hunting Smith Library

- Home to HWS' collections of books and archive materials
- Contains numerous books on the topic of LGBTQ+ studies and education
- Also provides access to numerous databases and online archives which can be used for, or specifically include LGBTQ+ studies — for example "LGBT Studies in Video"

| Princeton University | Located in Princeton, New Jersey : Princeton University has one of the most extensive and active LGBTQ+ Programming and Resource Centers in the United States. LGBTQ+ students have access to a wide variety of LGBTQ+ activities, lectures, events, etc. provided by the University. LGBTQ+ students also have specific resources provided by Princeton's housing, counseling, health, and scholarship services. |
| Massachusetts Institute of Technology | Located in Cambridge, Massachusetts: MIT is not only one of the top technical institutes in the world, it also boasts incredible services for LGBTQ+ students. Queer student life flourishes with numerous queer organizations, queer greek life, consistent education on LGBTQ+ identities, and LGBTQ+ career services. MIT is also renowned for their work with recognizing Intersectionality within queer identity. |
| University of Wisconsin – Eau Claire | Located in Eau Claire, Wisconsin: U Wisconsin Eau Claire offers incredibly queer student life activities. For example, the Eau Queer Film Festival which happens annually, the annual Drag Ball, and lectures on LGBTQ+ current events. UWEC also provides gender-inclusive housing. |
| University of Pennsylvania | Located in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania: UPenn provides some of the best LGBTQ+ services of any American campus, notably in health, counseling, housing, student life, and campus safety sectors. The UPenn LGBTQ+ Resource Center also provides things like Queer Mentors, Outreach Programs, and travel fund assistance. In addition to this, UPenn is one of the most Trans-Inclusive campuses in the U.S., including specific policies protecting Trans Students' name changes, bathroom rights, and health care. |
| University of California – Los Angeles | Located in Los Angeles, California: UCLA is located within one of the most queer-friendly cities in the world, putting you in direct access to numerous queer bars, restaurants, and cafés as well as outreach opportunities and community events. UCLA also is home to an entire institute on gender identity and public policy research which directly works to benefit the queer UCLA community. |
| University of Michigan | Located in Ann Arbor, Michigan: UMichigan is also located in one of the most queer-friendly cities in the country. In addition to having great services for LGBTQ+ students, they also have student groups for asexual students, queer and trans people of color, LGBTQ+ students in STEM disciplines, and LGBTQ+ business students. UMich also provides scholarships, holistic healthcare, and academic inclusion efforts to support LGBTQ+ students. |
| Cornell University | Located in Ithaca, New York: Cornell University offers great resources for LGBTQ+ students, including their resource center, which provides opportunities for activism, outreach, and education. In addition to this, Cornell provides great services, notably trans health services which cover ongoing counseling and HRT. |
| Harvey Mudd College | Located in Claremont, California: Harvey Mudd College ranks so highly due mainly to their extensive, and constantly updating LGBTQ+ campus policies, as well as their many housing options, highly trained staff, and incredibly strict procedures relating to LGBTQ+ safety on campus. |
| Ohio State University | Located in Columbus, Ohio: In addition to providing a Sexuality Studies major and minor, Ohio State is most well known for their work promoting intersectionality, and supporting the QPOC community. Ohio State has a q*munnity of queer students of color which works to promote social justice among the various intersections of race, gender, and sexuality. |
| Johns Hopkins University | Located in Baltimore, Maryland: Johns Hopkins includes a vast array of networking and leadership opportunities for queer students, including the Diversity Leadership Council, and the LGBTQ+ Networking group which works to connect queer students at JH with other queer students and alumni. Johns Hopkins also includes extensive policies and protections specifically for transgender students. |

| <p>Ithaca College Ithaca, NY</p> | <p>Ithaca College makes this list for their extensive work in providing adequate housing for Transgender Students, and working tirelessly to meet their housing needs. In addition to this, they have Gender Inclusive housing and a residence hall specifically for LGBTQ+ individuals. However, one of the most impressive services is through Ithaca's Speech Pathology program, which provides vocal training for Trans students who wish to have their voice match their identity, free of charge. Ithaca also provides healthcare coverage for HRT under their student health insurance.</p> |
| <p>University of Vermont Burlington, VT</p> | <p>The University of Vermont is one of the most proactive campuses for providing services and advocating for Transgender Students. Gender Identity and Expression have been included on the non-discrimination policy for over a decade. In more recent years, the University has begun hosting a student-run "Translating Identity Conference", and hosting "Trans 101" education seminars for the broader community. They also provide all-gender housing and bathrooms, and coverage of transition-related healthcare through student insurance.</p> |
| <p>University of Pennsylvania Philadelphia, PA</p> | <p>As noted in the previous list, UPenn has many LGBTQ+ services which they pride themselves on. Specifically for Transgender Students, UPenn provides some of the best on-campus Trans healthcare in the nation, including coverage of transition-related healthcare through student insurance.. Health Center staff is incredibly well trained and versed in Trans health. In addition, the campus is well known for providing incredibly effective Transgender education to faculty, staff, and students.</p> |
| <p>University of Oregon Eugene, OR</p> | <p>University of Oregon is unique because they are known for doing outreach without prompting from the state or from students. This preemptive policy making has allowed for an incredibly trans-inclusive community. The campus, therefore, has long offered all-gender housing and bathrooms, as well as all-gender locker rooms. The University of Oregon also provides coverage of transition-related healthcare through student insurance.</p> |
| <p>New York University New York, NY</p> | <p>NYU is not only one of the top schools for the arts (amongst other things!) in the United States, it also offers a vibrant trans community on its campus. With events like their Annual Trans Awareness Week, Gender Bender Ball, and their Trans-Student group, the T-Party – there are tons of social options for Trans students. NYU also offers great healthcare and services for their transgender students.</p> |
| <p>University of California – Los Angeles Los Angeles, CA</p> | <p>As noted in the previous list, LA is one of the best cities in the world for all LGBTQ+ people. However, UCLA also offers incredible resources for Trans students. UCLA was one of the first schools to cover hormones and surgeries for transitioning students under its student health insurance, and it has becoming increasingly accessible over the years. In addition, the school provides trans-inclusive athletic facilities, housing, and restrooms.</p> |
| <p>University of Massachusetts – Amherst Amherst, MA</p> | <p>Home to the first LGBTQ+ only residence hall, UMass Amherst has recently become increasingly supportive of their Trans students. Trans students are able to participate as their identified gender in intramural sports, have access to health care to support their transitions, and also a resource book intensively outlining all providers of mental and physical health, cosmetology, and other services specific to transgender students.</p> |
| <p>University of Michigan – Ann Arbor Ann Arbor, MI</p> | <p>UMich at Ann Arbor is home to the first college LGBT Center in the United States. Due to this history of celebrating queer identity, Trans students have long been supported on the Ann Arbor Campus. Students note that trans peers are incredibly visible, and this allows for a lively trans community to flourish. UMich provides gender inclusive housing and restrooms, as well as medical coverage for HRT and some other transitional services.</p> |
| <p>Johns Hopkins University Baltimore, MD</p> | <p>Johns Hopkins is also incredibly trans-inclusive and trans positive campus. In addition to providing health insurance which covers transition services, the campus also provides extensive all-gender bathrooms, and all-gender housing. Hopkins also has extensive and constantly updating transgender policies which protect students from harassment and hardship on campus.</p> |
| <p>Princeton University Princeton, NJ</p> | <p>Princeton University has an incredibly extensive Transgender community. With support groups such as "Beyond the Binary", and "The Gender Group", there are multiple ways to meet and interact with the rest of the campus' trans community. In addition, Princeton offers gender-inclusive housing, all-gender bathrooms, and healthcare coverage for HRT and trans-related mental health services.</p> |

LGBTQ+ Scholarships for New York Schools

Regardless of whether applying to a public or private institution, the costs of tuition can often be too high for families and individuals to afford on their own. Luckily, in addition to the many scholarships that are provided for academics, athletics, etc. there are also some scholarships specifically for LGBTQ+ students within New York State.

| New York Ramblers Scholarship for Student Athletes | The New York Ramblers Scholarship for student athletes was create to support student-athletes who self-identify as either lesbian, gay, bisexual, queer, or intersex (LGBTQI), or are demonstrated and committed allies. Awardees will receive a one-time scholarship, paid directly to their college, to cover tuition and fees. | Up to 2 Scholarships for \$2,500 |
| Levin-Goffe Scholarship Fund | The Levin-Goffe Scholarship Fund was established to cover up to two years of schooling for immigrants here in New York City who identify as LGBTQI. Students must be full-time students in a New York City nonprofit college or university; the annual tuition must not exceed \$12,500. Applicants must have successfully completed at least one academic year or is at least a rising sophomore and have a minimum 3.25 GPA. | Variable |
| SOULE Foundation Scholarship | For LGBTQ+ individuals from NY, CT, or NJ. Award criteria based on the demonstration of past leadership and community service involvement, academic credentials, personal essay, letters of recommendation, an individual interview, and a financial need | \$2,500 |
| The Rochester Area Community Foundation's Rochester LGBTQ Scholarship | This scholarship is available to all students from in the eight-county area surrounding Rochester* and have enrolled in a program in public health, nonprofit administration, or social justice activism. The applicant must also demonstrate a commitment to social justice activism regarding LGBTQ+ rights. | Minimum of \$1,000 |

Scholarships for QTPOC

There are many LGBTQ+ scholarships, but there are also some scholarships specifically available for **QTPOC** (Queer/Trans People of Color). While these are only a few examples of scholarships for QTPOC, there are many other scholarships that can be found on the databases listed on the National Scholarships page.

| Audre Lorde Scholarship Awards | The Audre Lorde Scholarship Awards are designed to recognize out* black lesbians and lesbians of color making significant contributions to their communities. ZAMI NOBLA wants to support and encourage their continuing education by providing scholarships to those women enrolled in accredited technical, undergraduate and graduate programs. *Out is defined as an acknowledgement of lesbian identify to self, and to family, friends, and community. | \$1,000 or more |
| Levin-Goffe Scholarship for LGBTQI Immigrants | The Levin-Goffe Scholarship provides a measure of financial stability to undergraduate students who are both LGBTQ or intersex and undocumented immigrants. Eligible applicants are all those who: Are lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, queer, or intersex; Do not hold U.S. citizenship, a green card, or an F-1 visa; Have a current, most recent, or cumulative GPA of at least 3.25; Are enrolled at an accredited, nonprofit school in New York City; and Have completed one academic year / are at least a rising sophomore | Awarding a total of \$25,000 for up to two years of school. |
| Bill Caspare Memorial Fund Diversity Scholarship | The Bill Caspare Memorial Fund Diversity Scholarship is available to full - time junior and senior students who are African - American, Asian American, Hispanic American, Native American, multiracial, or part of the LGBTQ community. You must be interested in new media / digital advertising / data science, and have a minimum 3.25 GPA to be eligible for this award. | \$10,000 |
